


#### Flock size and farmer age







#### Farmers views on resistance

#### **27%** said

I am not worried about wormer resistance. My worming programme is working well and I don't think I need to test for resistance until I feel there is a problem.

#### 16% said

Wormer resistance is something I am very worried about, because I've noticed performance declining in recent years and have established that I have resistance on the farm. I am working with my Vet/advisor to build a worming programme to help reduce the impact of wormer resistance on my farm.

#### The majority 55% said

Wormer resistance is something I am fairly worried about. Although my worming programme is working ok, I suspect performance has dipped in recent years and wonder if it might be due to resistance. I am considering testing to establish my resistance status.










Awareness of resistance by region














 Do you have a strategy that addresses wormer resistance?

• No – 36%






- Understanding the problem?





However seasonal variation on wormer resistance must be considered.







Separating incoming stock is not a universal practice
















 Drenching incoming stock is not practiced by all

Pasture contamination









- In general vet contact has increased over the last 5 years









